This is my response to the consultation on the Anti Discrimination Act reform.
Please publish this submission under my full name.

My primary concerns that I would like you to consider are:

* Introducing the idea of intersectionality encourages multiple protected attributes shopping or stacking, incentivizing complainants to claim as many as possible. This leads to a problem because alternative bases of discrimination are already provided for, and if one is valid, it should not matter whether there are multiple grounds.

* A subjective approach towards vilification is not appropriate because it creates an unpredictable threshold and focuses on whether a person was likely to experience offense, which varies from person to person. This results in an inconsistent and unjust application of the law, emphasizing individual perception rather than objective criteria.

* Lowering the burden of proof and shifting it to defendants is wrong because it disproportionately affects small businesses, who don't have the resources to defend themselves. Furthermore, it risks trivialising genuine claims by making it easier to bring frivolous lawsuits.

It has become all too common for several branches of the Australian Government to push for censorship of, and the ability to spy on, Australian Citizens under the guise of safety, and protecting "marginalised" people.

We know what the real goal is, and your traitorous ways will be met with resistance at every turn. Your role is to serve your people, not control them.
